Once more the angel went further, and stood in a narrow place where there was not enough room to pass.

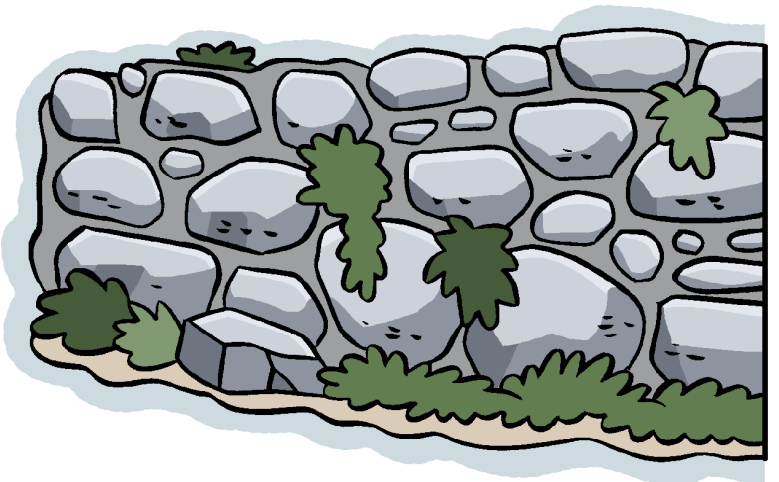
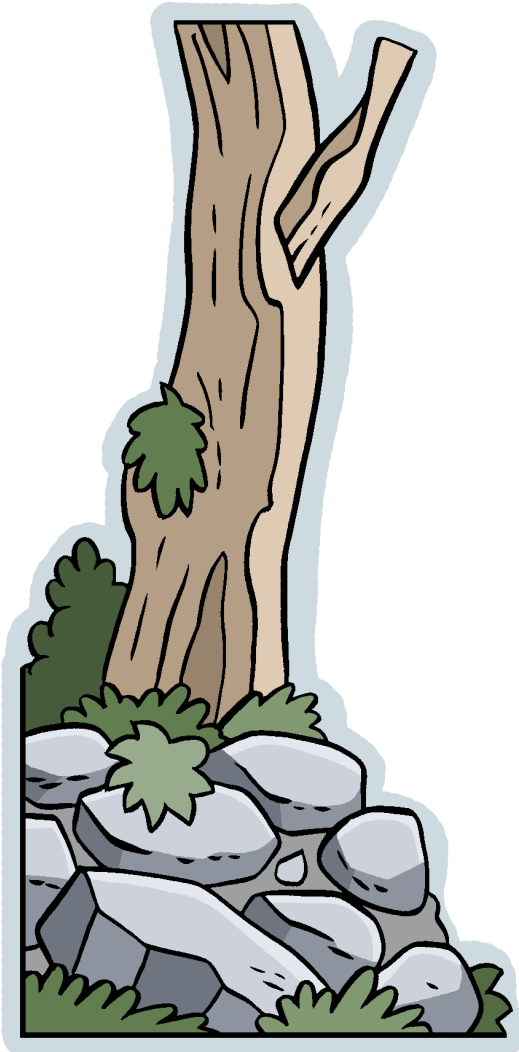
