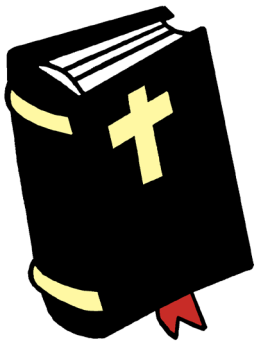

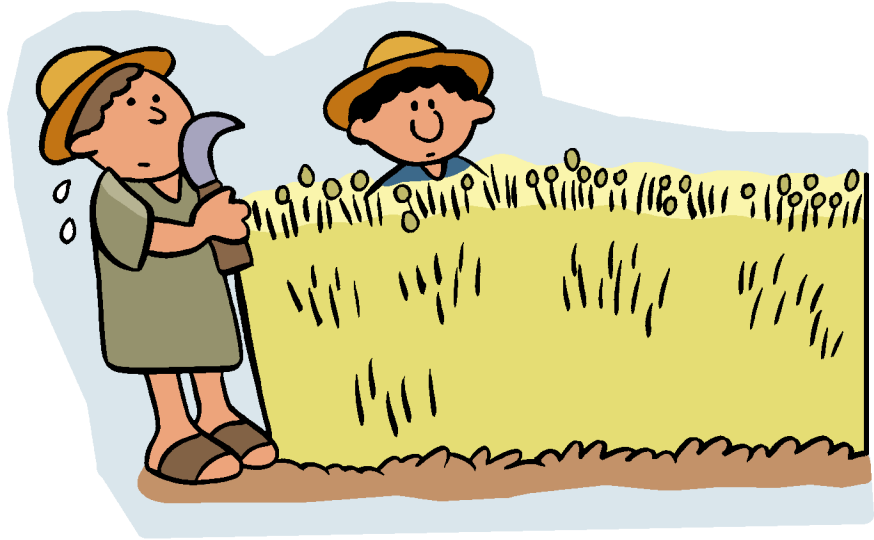

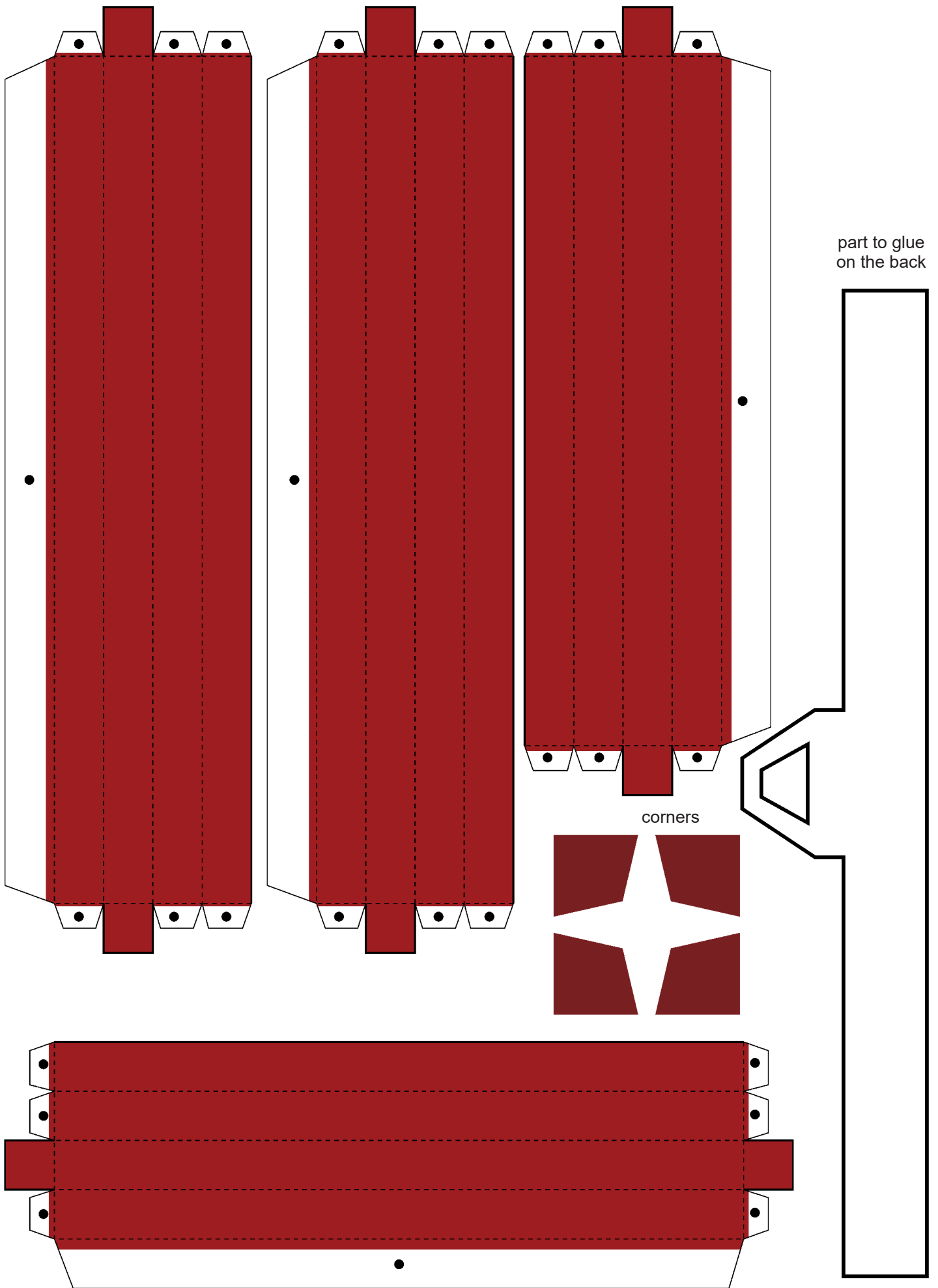
Then I will relax and think to myself, “You lucky man! You have everything you need for many years to come; so now you can enjoy your life, eating, drinking, and having fun.”

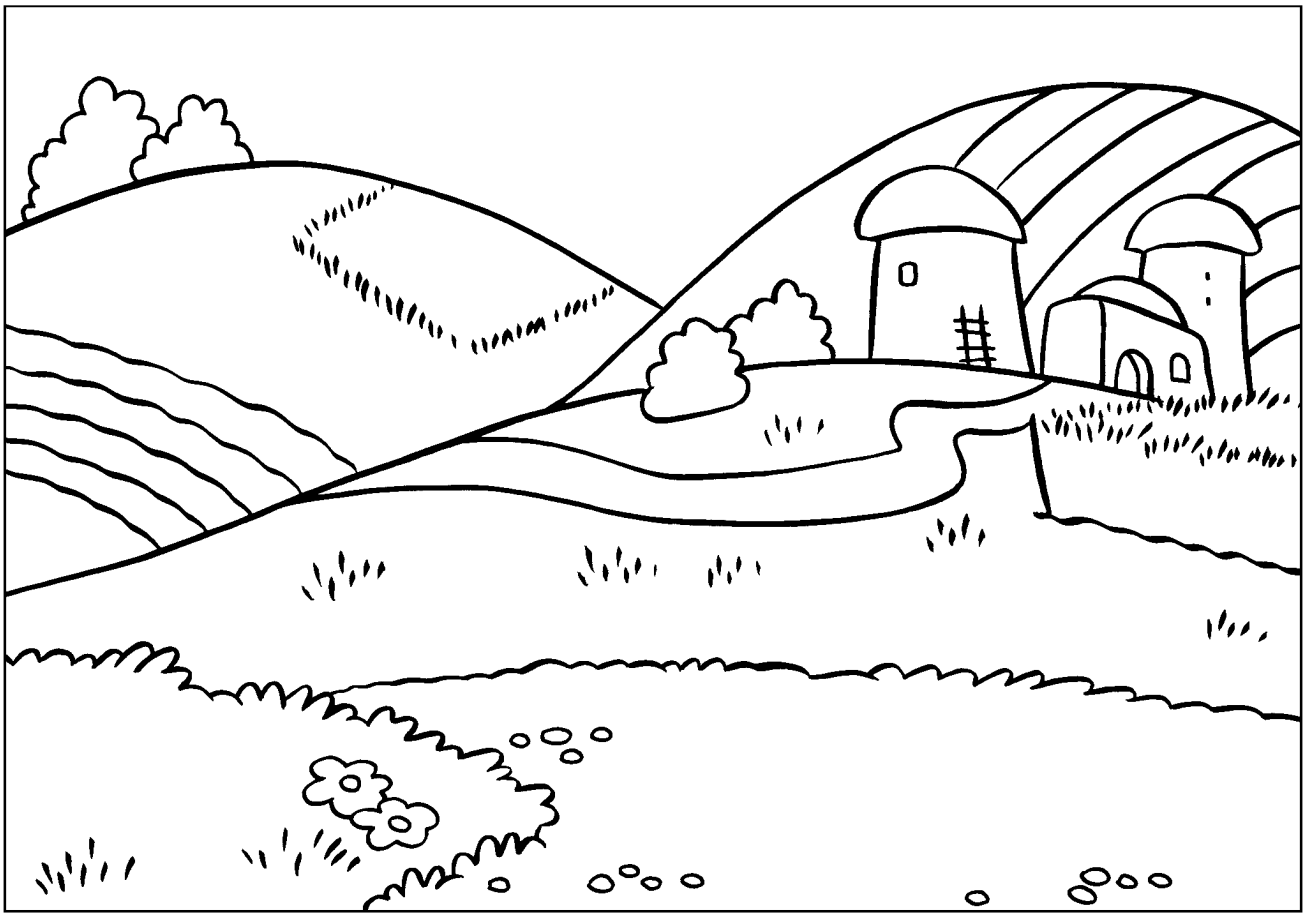

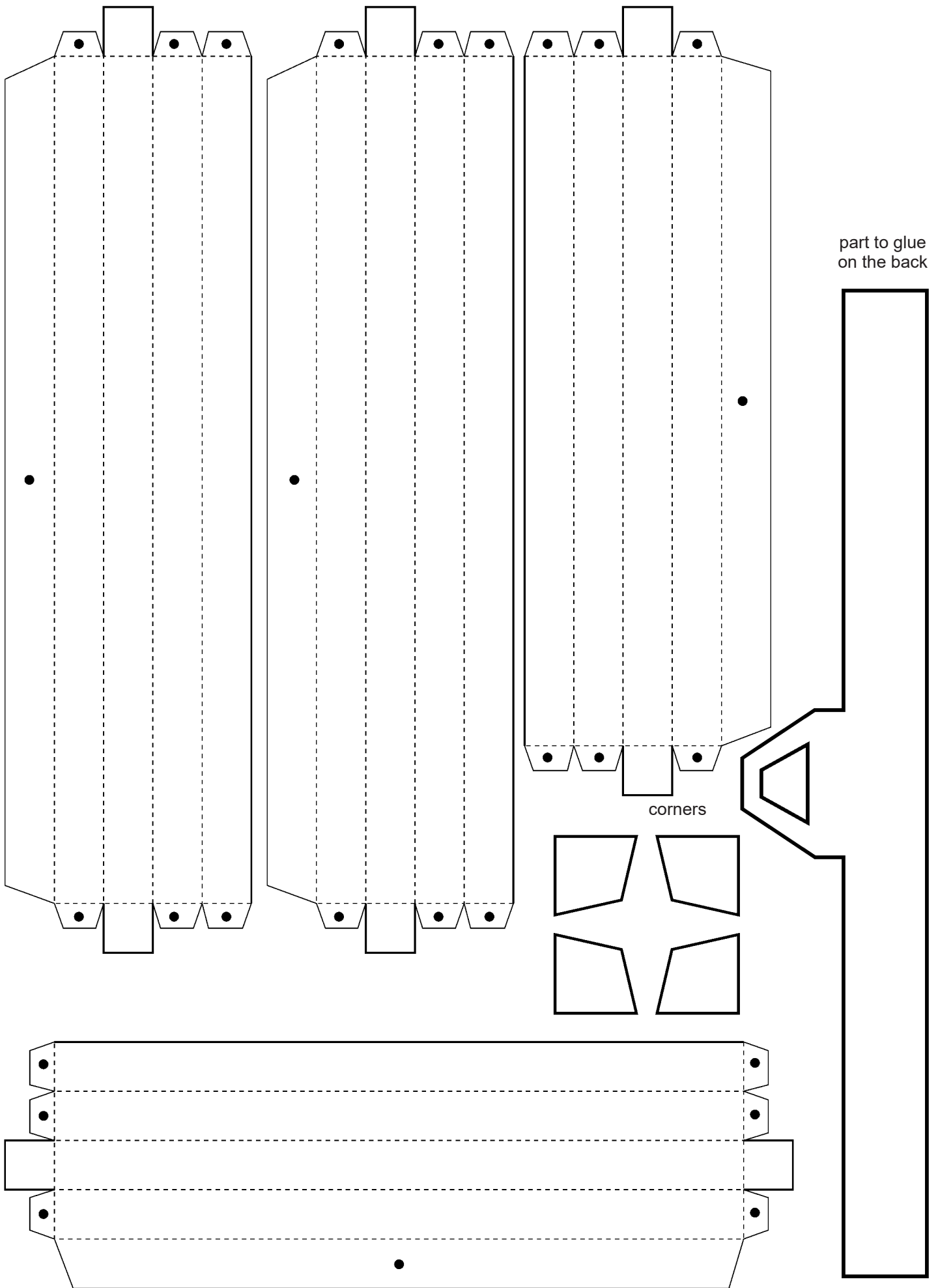
