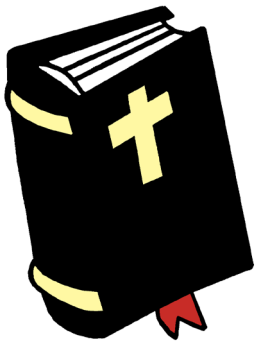


Feeding the multitudes

“Are we supposed to go and buy enough bread to feed everybody?” Philip asked.

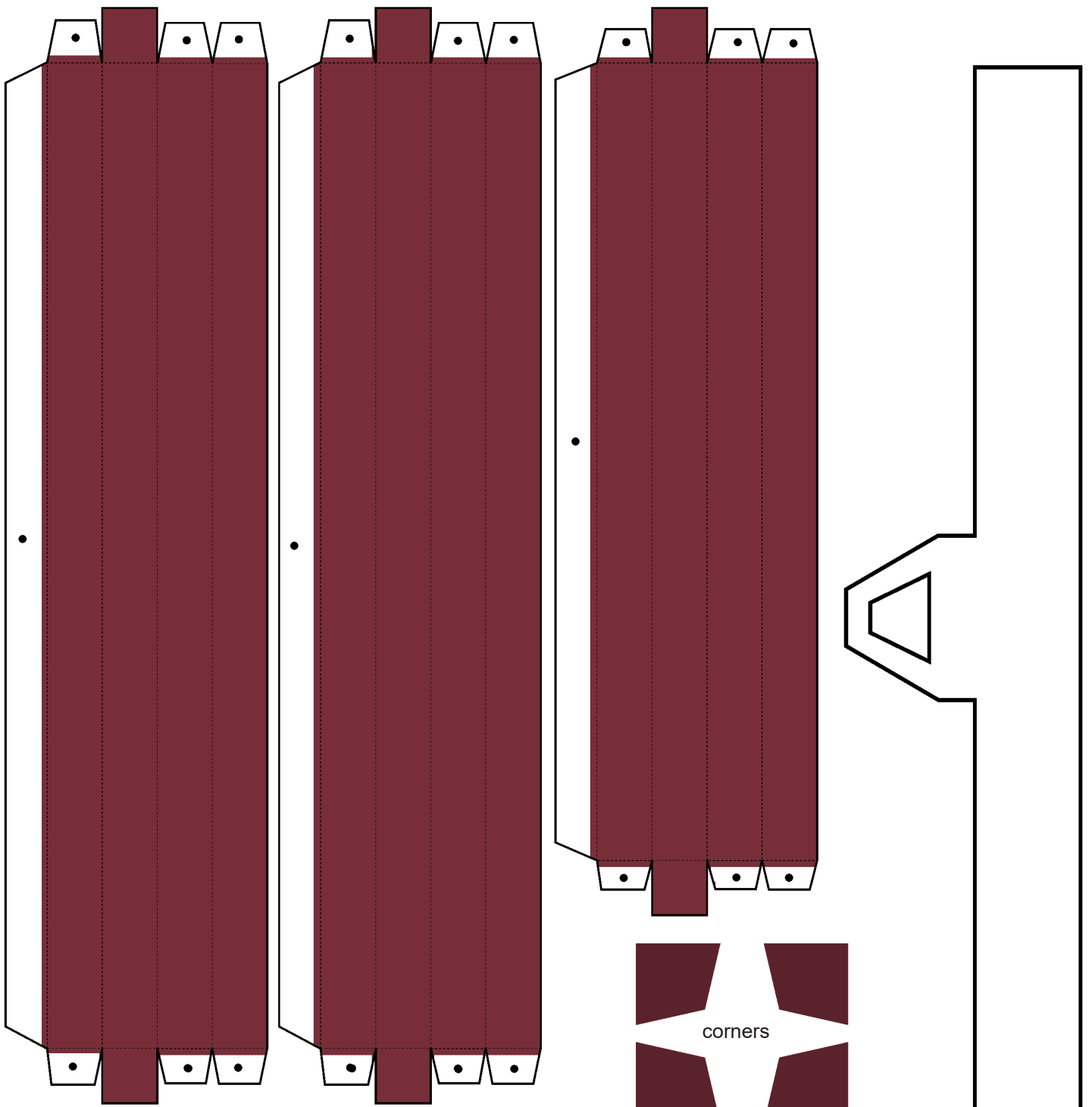
