

The City of Jerusalem

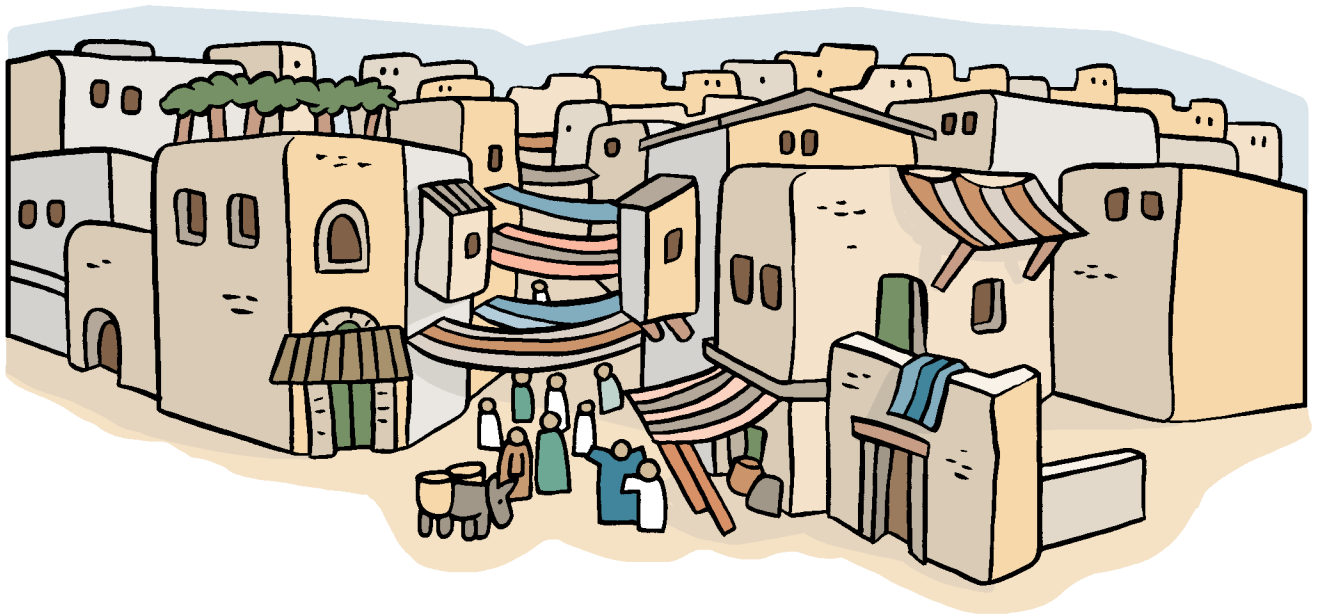
Jerusalem, an important city in the Middle East, is located on a plateau in the Judaeen Mountains between the Mediterranean Sea and the Dead Sea.

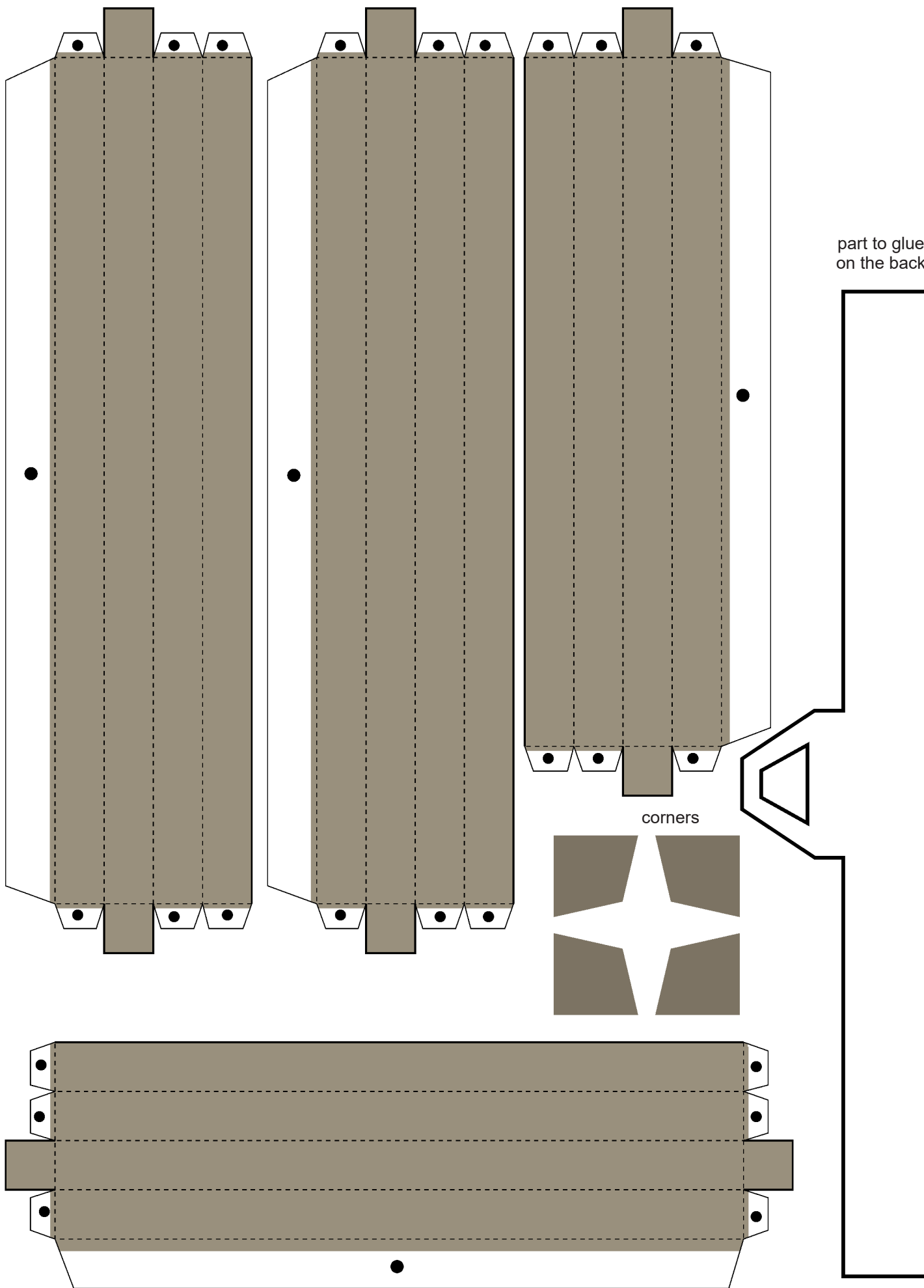

Today, the location of Jerusalem is in the country Israel.

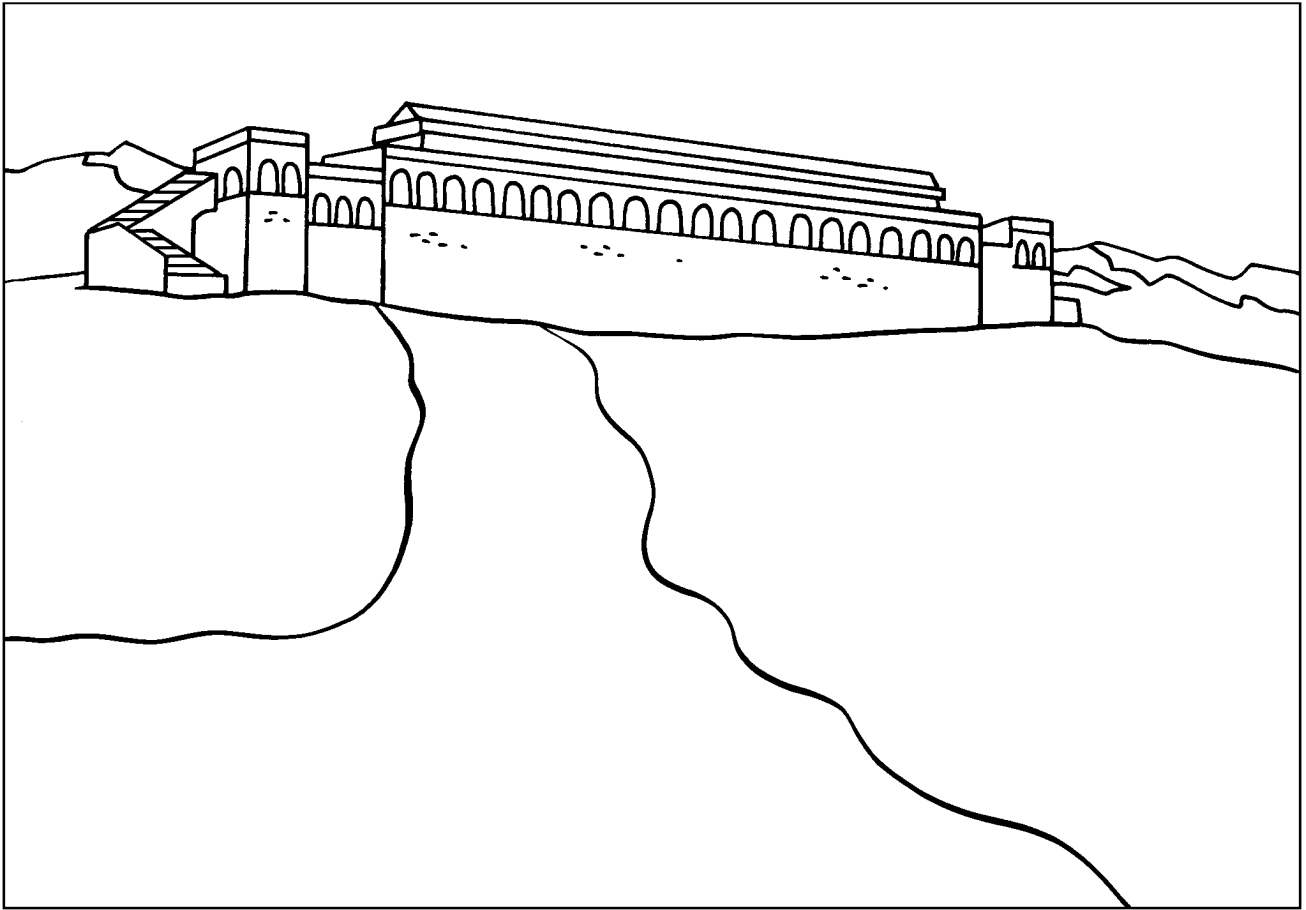
