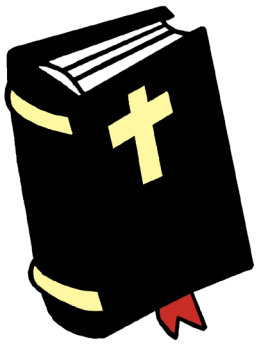

The Rich Man and Lazarus



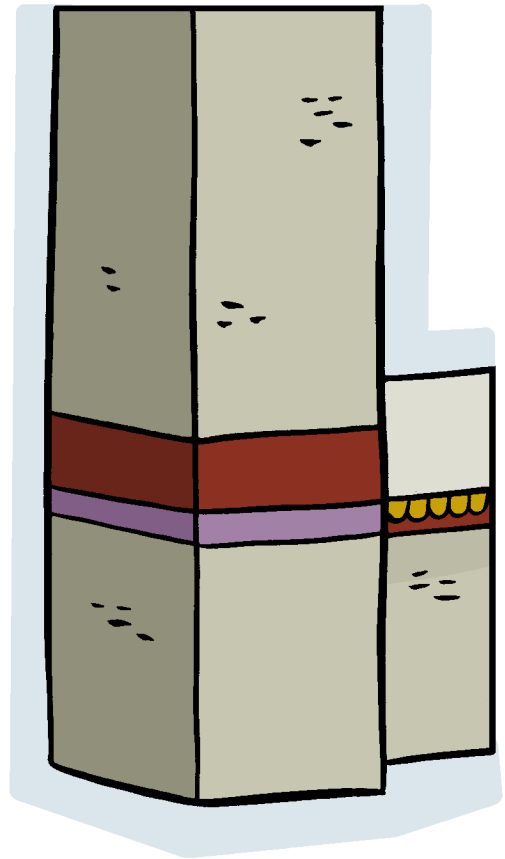
When some of the Pharisees were making fun of Jesus, He responded by telling them this parable.

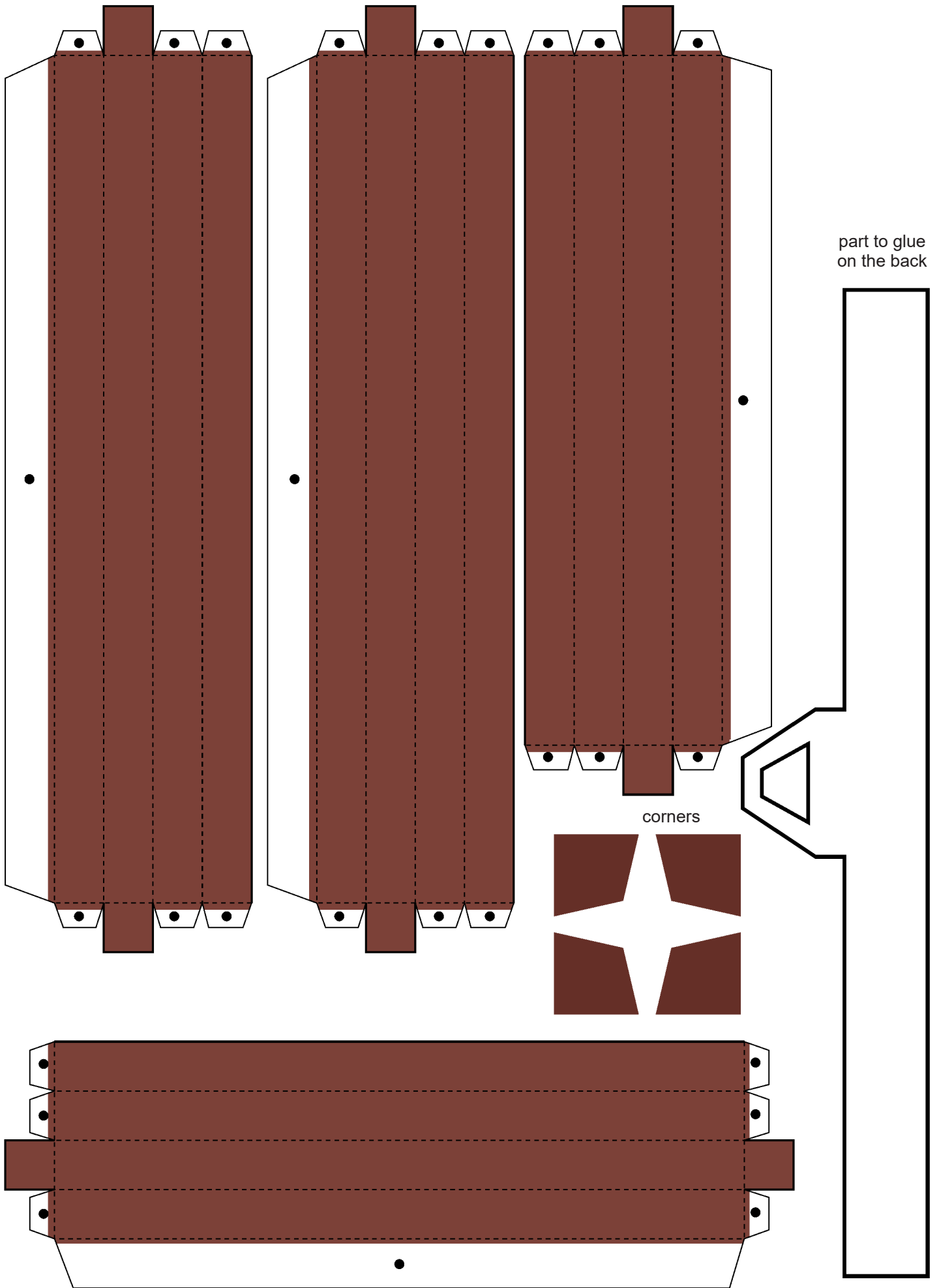
