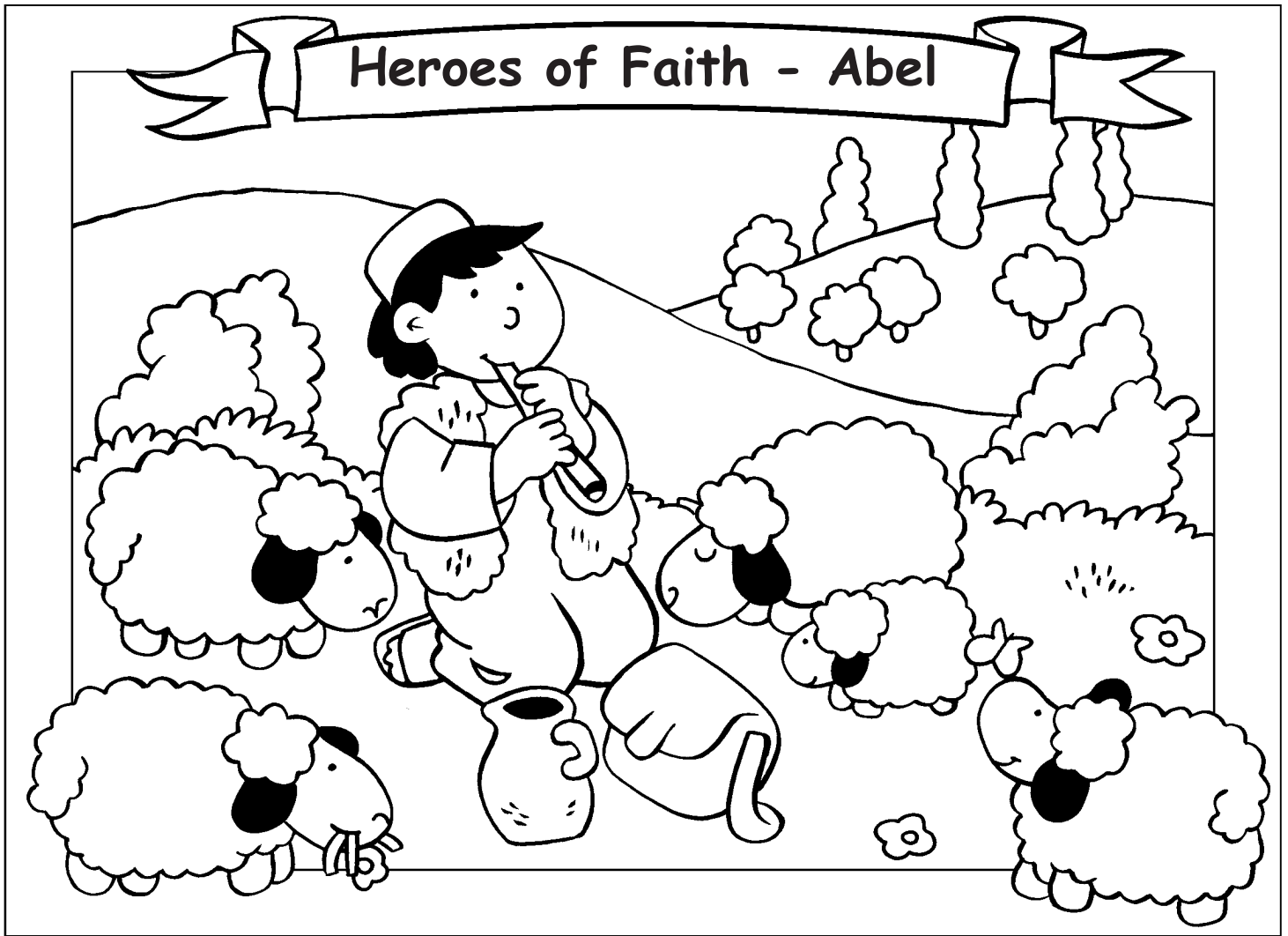
Heroes of Faith - Abel
